The imple Romania ranks 55th out of 189 countries for ease of paying taxes, says PwC



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Romania has ranked 55th in PwC's 'Paying Taxes 2016' global ranking, which measures the ease of paying taxes for a standard company across 189 economies all over the world, the company announced today.

The fact that Romania is positioned in the first third of the Paying Taxes ranking services Leader withPwC Romania.

By reducing the social security contributions (CAS) in the autumn of 2014 Romania saw its 2015 tax rate (which measures the amount of taxes and contributions payable by businesses and expressed as a share of their profit) drop from 43.2 percent to 42 percent. This means that in this year's edition Romania ranked above countries like Bulgaria (88), the Czech Republic (122), the Slovak Republic (72), Poland (58) and Hungary (95), but still below Croatia (28), Slovenia (35) and the Baltic states (Estonia being ranked 30th, the Republic of Latvia 27th

"This reinforces the necessity of maintaining a sustained rhythm of reforms, for which the coming into force of the new Tax Code will be of significant service," stracead Mitroi

Romania's total tax rate in 2015 of 42 percent was below the Central and Eastern European's countries average rate of 45 percent and close to the global average of 40.8 percent, shows PwC data.

tomania is doing even better for the time needed to comply with the tax legislation. With an average company spending 159 working hours a year for tax compliance, compared to a regional average of 218 hours and to a dobal average of 264 hours. Romania is among the leading CEE countries, said PwC representatives.

In terms of the number of tax fillings and payments a company has to perform annually, Romanian companies egistered a number of 14 such payments, well above a regional average of 9.5 payments but below a global one

Romania has made significant progress in this department in recent years – from 39 payments in the 2014 edition of Paying Taxes to 14 payments in this years's edition mainly due to the implementation and ecognition of the electronic tax filling and payment system,s aid PwC representatives. This upgrade has in urn generated a significant boost in the global ranking as well, going up from the 134th position to the 55th. Vevertheless, Romania's number is still higher than the CEE countries average. "The reason for this gap is that, along with the payments of standard central taxes, companies also have to make payments to the local budgets,"

Government looks to expand programmers' tax relief to start-ups

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Romania's government is looking for ways to modify the law exempting companies from the payment of the 16 percent income tax for employing programmers, in a bid to include start-ups, Marius Bostan, the mister of communications stated, as quoted by startupcafe.ro.

At the moment, the law only includes companies that can demonstrate an income of at least USD 10,000 for each such employee during the previous fiscal year. Posts that can benefit from this tax relief include data base administrators, analysts, informatics system engineers, software system engineers, informatics project managers, programmers, informatics system designers and informatics systems programmers.

Bostan stated the Ministry of Communications is working together with three other ministries to create an order including start-ups.

"Based on the previous order, a company ad to demonstrate it had produced software for two years to benefit from the exemption. It's not normal this is not applicable for start-ups, I think we should find the exact definition, because start-ups are a vital force in the economy," the minister stated during a local TV interview.

PM Ciolos hints at complete overhaul of local taxation system, including property

Prime Minister Dacian Ciolos suggested the government is looking at ways to improve the financing mechanism for local authorities, citing changes in the property tax as one way to boost revenue at local level.

In a statement made at the meeting of the Association of Communes in Romania, the PM explained that the local administration is highly fragmented and that the process of regionalization should come back on the public agenda.

For instance, he stated that Romania could have between 15 and 18 administrative regions by merging 2-3 counties

In the case of local authorities. Ciolos stated that there needs to be a greater focus on the attraction of Foreign Direct Investments and on the reduction of tax evasion

"The redesign of the local taxation system - especially the property tax - maybe we could look at taxation based on the market value of property, not on its location, "stated the PM in his speech.

The property tax has gone through some changes in the new Fiscal Code that was enforced starting this year.
